The committee on Counties on the part of the Senate, to whom was committed the House Bill increasing the minimum compensation of full-time probation officers for certain district courts, and further regulating deductions from the salaries of probation officers for district courts on account of absence (House, No. 2590), — report recommending that the same ought to pass with an amendment substituting an “Order relative to authorizing the committee on Counties to sit during the recess of the General Court for the purpose of making an investigation and study relative to the compensation of full-time probation officers for certain district courts and related matters” (see Senate, No. 667).

Ordered, That the committee on Counties be authorized to sit during the recess of the General Court for the purpose of making an investigation and study of the subject matter of current House document numbered 2590 relative to increasing the minimum compensation of full-time probation officers for certain district courts, and further regulating deductions from the salaries of probation officers for district courts on account of absence.

Said committee shall report to the General Court the results of its study and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry said recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk of the Senate on or before the first Wednesday of December in the current year.
