AN ACT PROVIDING FOR CERTAIN ANNUAL FEES FOR THE USE OF THE LIEUTENANT WILLIAM F. CALLAHAN, JR. TUNNEL AND THE SUMNER TUNNEL BY CERTAIN PERSONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary,
2 the Massachusetts Turnpike Authority shall, upon the applica-
3 tion of an owner of a passenger motor vehicle registered in the
4 commonwealth and the payment of a five-dollar fee, issue to
5 said owner a sticker to be displayed on such motor vehicle
6 which shall entitle said motor vehicle to pass toll free through
7 the Lieutenant William F. Callahan, Jr. tunnel and the Sumner
8 tunnel during the calendar year in which said sticker is issued.

in the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventeen

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR CERTAIN SPECIAL CASES FOR THE LAW IN THIS
 COMMONWEALTH, AND TO REVISE AND AMEND THE SEVERAL
 LAWS IN THAT BEARING THEREON.

Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the
 Commonwealth of Massachusetts, in the year one thousand nine hundred
 and seventeen.

1. Notwithstanding any statute or special law to the contrary,
2. the Massachusetts Probate Authority shall, upon the application
3. of an owner of a messenger motor vehicle registered in this
4. Commonwealth and the payment of a fee of ten dollars, have the
5. right to have a license to be displayed on such motor vehicle
6. with a plate on the said motor vehicle to give full force through
7. the Commonwealth, in the same manner and to the same
8. extent as if the said motor vehicle were a motor vehicle.
