RESOLVE EXTENDING THE TIME WITHIN WHICH THE UNPAID SPECIAL COMMISSION ON AUDIT OF STATE NEEDS IS REQUIRED TO COMPLETE ITS INVESTIGATION AND STUDY AND FILE ITS REPORTS.

1 *Resolved*, That the time within which the unpaid special com-
2 mission, known as the special commission on audit of state needs,
3 established by chapter thirty-eight of the resolves of nineteen
4 hundred and fifty-seven, is required to complete its investiga-
5 tion and study and file its reports on the subject matters referred
6 to it is hereby extended to December thirty-first, nineteen hun-
7 dred and sixty. Said commission may expend for expert, legal
8 and other services and expenses the unexpended balance avail-
9 able in item 0258-01 of section two of chapter seven hundred
10 and forty-three of the acts of nineteen hundred and fifty-seven,
11 and such other sums as may be appropriated therefor. Said
12 commission shall report to the general court and to the governor
13 the results of its investigation and study and its recommenda-
14 tions, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry
15 such recommendations into effect by filing the same with the
16 clerk of the house of representatives and a copy thereof with
17 the governor at such time or times as it may deem advisable; pro-
18 vided, however, that it shall continue to file quarterly reports
19 and shall file a final report not later than December thirty first,
20 nineteen hundred and sixty.
