AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS TO RECONSTRUCT AND WIDEN RAILROAD BRIDGE AND CHARLES RIVER BRIDGE IN THE TOWN OF BELLINGHAM.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 The department of public works is hereby authorized and
- 2 directed to reconstruct and widen Railroad bridge and Charles
- 3 River bridge in Bellingham center in the town of Bellingham.

The Commission of Government

in the District of Columbia

1. The Commission of Government shall be composed of five members, to be appointed by the President, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, for a term of five years, and shall hold office until their successors are appointed.

2. The Commission shall have the honor and privilege of the Senate, and shall be organized as a body corporate, and shall have the right to sue and be sued, to contract, and to hold real and personal property.

3. The Commission shall have the right to call for and receive from any department or officer of the Government such information and reports as it may deem necessary for the proper discharge of its duties.

4. The Commission shall have the right to hold public hearings and to receive testimony under oath, and to administer oaths.

5. The Commission shall have the right to make and publish reports from time to time, and to transmit the same to the President and the Senate.
