AN ACT RELATIVE TO REIMBURSEMENT OF CITIES, TOWNS, AND REGIONAL SCHOOL DISTRICTS EMPLOYING SCHOOL ADJUSTMENT COUNSELLORS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 46G of chapter 71 of the General Laws as most  
2 recently amended by section 58 of chapter 14 of the acts of  
3 1966, and by chapter 66 of the acts of 1968 is hereby  
4 amended further by striking out the last sentence and insert-  
5 ing in place thereof the following sentence:—Any city, town,  
6 and regional school district employing one or more school  
7 adjustment counsellors in accordance with this section shall  
8 annually receive for salary and expenses through the Depart-  
9 ment of Youth Services, upon attested claim made therefor  
10 by the school committee on a form provided by said depart-  
11 ment reimbursement from the commonwealth of fifty per  
12 cent of the salary and expenses incurred by said city, town, or  
13 regional school district for the cost of the services of said  
14 school adjustment counsellors.
