By Mr. Herman of Worcester, petition of Theodore M. Herman (with the approval of the mayor and city council) for legislation to provide that towns using the lockup facilities of the city of Worcester be made liable for the reasonable expenses of the detention and support of certain persons detained therein. AN ACT PROVIDING THAT TOWNS USING THE LOCKUP FACILITIES OF THE CITY OF WORCESTER SHALL BE LIABLE FOR THE REASONABLE EXPENSES OF THE DETENTION AND SUPPORT OF CERTAIN PERSONS DETAINED THEREIN.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, any
2 town using the lockup facilities of the city of Worcester for
3 the detention of a person under arrest, shall pay to said city
4 the reasonable expense, not exceeding fifty dollars, of the
5 detention and support of said person.
