AN ACT AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS TO MAINTAIN AND RESTORE CERTAIN MILESTONE MARKERS IN THE COMMONWEALTH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 The department of public works is hereby authorized and
- 2 directed to maintain and restore all milestone markers in the
- 3 Commonwealth placed during or prior to the year 1800 as in-
- 4 dicated by the Register of Historic Places in accordance with
- 5 the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966.

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA
