
By Mr. Kimball of Springfield, petition of Philip K. Kimball for the creation of the Boston-Springfield highway authority for the purpose of constructing a four-lane limited access toll highway between said cities. Highways and Motor Vehicles.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE BOSTON-SPRINGFIELD HIGHWAY AUTHORITY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. There is hereby created the Boston-
2 Springfield Highway Authority of five public trustees,
3 who shall be appointed in the manner provided by
4 section two of chapter five hundred and forty-four
5 of the acts of nineteen hundred and forty-seven for
6 the appointment of the trustees therein referred to,
7 for the purpose of immediately constructing a four-
8 lane limited access toll highway between the cities
9 of Springfield and Boston.

1 SECTION 2. The Authority shall have the right to
2 take by eminent domain any property deemed neces-
3 sary for the construction of said highway.

1 SECTION 3. For the purpose of providing funds
2 necessary to effect the purposes set forth herein, the
3 Authority may issue bonds in such amount as shall
4 be approved by the governor and council.

It is the duty of the State to provide for the education of its children, and to that end it is authorized to appropriate money from the State Treasury for that purpose.

The Commission on Education

1. Section 1. There is hereby created the State Board of Education, which shall be composed of nine members, to be appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Senate.
2. Section 2. The State Board of Education shall have the honor and dignity of a State Board of Education, and shall be a body corporate, with the power to sue and be sued, to hold real and personal property, to acquire, hold, and dispose of real and personal property, and to do all such things as may be necessary or proper for the purposes of this act.
3. Section 3. The State Board of Education shall have the honor and dignity of a State Board of Education, and shall be a body corporate, with the power to sue and be sued, to hold real and personal property, to acquire, hold, and dispose of real and personal property, and to do all such things as may be necessary or proper for the purposes of this act.
4. Section 4. For the purpose of providing funds for the State Board of Education, there is hereby authorized the appropriation of such amount as shall be necessary for the operation and support of the State Board of Education.
