AN ACT RELATIVE TO CERTAIN CHANGES OF LAWS IN THE TOWN OF SAUGUS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The voters of the town of Saugus are hereby au-
2 thorized to make changes in chapter seventeen as
3 may be required by an initiative petition of five per
4 cent of the registered voters, and vote on town legal
5 authority without approval of the general court.
