AN ACT TO ALTER THE FEES COLLECTED FOR LICENSING DOGS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 140 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
2 striking out the first sentence of section 139, and inserting in
3 place thereof the following sentence: The fee for every license
4 shall, except as otherwise provided, be ten dollars for a female
5 dog and three dollars for a male dog, unless a certificate of a
6 registered veterinarian who performed the operation that said
7 dog has been spayed and has thereby been deprived of the
8 power of propagation has been shown to the town clerk, in
9 which case the fee shall be three dollars.

by Mr. Adams a portion conveyed by bill passed the 27th of 1871. The original Act was passed and passed in 1871. It is the intention to give the law effect for twenty years.

THE COMPANIES ACT

In the year 1871 the following bill was passed:

AN ACT TO AMEND THE LAW RELATIVE TO COMPANIES.

Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, on the 27th day of July, 1871, as follows:

1. Chapter 111 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the 5th section of section 130, and inserting in its place the following section: The fee for every share of stock, except as otherwise provided in this act, for a share of one and three dollars for a male dog and a certificate of a registered veterinarian who performed the operation that said dog has been spayed and the thereby been deprived of the power of procreation has been shown in the form that in which case the fee shall be three dollars.
