RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT RELATIVE TO THE EFFECTS OF THE MASSACHUSETTS TURNPIKE EXTENSION ON THE ALLSTON/BRIGHTON AREA OF BOSTON REGARDING SOUND AND AIR POLLUTION.

1 *Resolved*, That the department of environmental management is
2 hereby authorized and directed to make an investigation and study
3 relative to the effect of the Massachusetts Turnpike Extension as it
4 relates to the Brighton/ Allston area of Boston and its concomitant
5 effect on sound and air pollution. Said department shall report to
6 the general court, the results of its investigation and study, and its
7 recommendations, if any, together with drafts of such legislation as
8 may be necessary to carry such recommendations into effect, by
9 filing the same with the clerk of the house of representatives on or
10 before the last Wednesday of December, nineteen hundred and
11 seventy-nine.
