

HOUSE No. 1171

By Mr. McDonald of Chelsea, petition of the Massachusetts Relief Officers Association for legislation to require the furnishing of information to local boards of public welfare. Public Welfare.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-Five.

An Act requiring the Furnishing of Information to Local Boards of Public Welfare.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter one hundred and seventeen of the General
2 Laws is hereby amended by striking out section thir-
3 teen, as appearing in the Tercentenary edition, and
4 inserting in place thereof the following:—

5 *Section 13.* A treasurer of a savings bank, insti-
6 tution for savings, national bank, trust company,
7 co-operative bank, benefit association, insurance com-
8 pany, safe deposit company or any employer who,
9 upon request in writing signed by a member of the
10 board of public welfare of a town, unreasonably re-
11 fuses to inform him of the amount deposited in the
12 corporation or association to the credit of or the
13 amount of wages or compensation earned by a person
14 named in such request who has applied to such town
15 for relief or who is a charge upon such town, or who
16 wilfully renders false information in reply to such
17 request, shall forfeit fifty dollars to the use of such
18 town.
