The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Eight.

AN ACT RELATING TO THE PHYSICAL CONDITION OF PUPILS PARTICIPATING IN INTERSCHOLASTIC SPORTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 47 of chapter 71 of the General Laws, as most
2 recently amended by sections 3 and 4 of chapter 301 of the
3 acts of 1962, is hereby further amended by striking out the
4 second sentence and inserting in place thereof the following
5 sentence:—It may directly or through an authorized repre-
6 sentative determine under what conditions the same may
7 compete with similar organizations in other schools, provided
8 that no pupil shall participate in interscholastic sports unless
9 his physician has submitted to the school physician a report
10 that such pupil is free from any physical ailment as evidenced
11 by analyzing an electrocardiogram and an encephalograph of
12 such pupil.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE EDUCATIONAL SYSTEM OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS.

Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the majority of the votes in each house thereon, February 1, 1911.

- 1 Section 27 of chapter VI of the General Laws as amended
- 2 hereby amended by sections 2 and 3 of chapter 209 of the
- 3 acts of 1911, insofar as they relate to sections 27 and 28
- 4 of said chapter and sections 27 and 28 of the
- 5 Statutes, is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 6 Sections 27 and 28 of said chapter shall be amended to
- 7 contain the following provisions, to-wit:
- 8 That no pupil shall be admitted to any school or
- 9 institution of learning in this Commonwealth unless
- 10 that such pupil has previously received an educational
- 11 certificate or diploma from a school or institution of
- 12 learning in this Commonwealth.
