AN ACT PROVIDING ADEQUATE COURT HOUSE ACCOMMODATIONS AND FACILITIES FOR THE THIRD DISTRICT COURT OF BRISTOL IN THE CITY OF NEW BEDFORD.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. For the purposes of providing adequate
2 court house accommodations and facilities for the Third
3 District Court of Bristol in the city of New Bedford,
4 the county commissioners of the county of Bristol are
5 hereby authorized and directed to cause preliminary
6 plans and specifications to be prepared for the addition
7 and alterations to said district court. For said purposes,
8 said commissioners may expend such sums, not exceeding
9 five thousand dollars, as may be appropriated therefor
10 in the year nineteen hundred and fifty-six.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
