RESOLVE

Granting a County Tax for the County of Franklin.

- 1 *Resolved*, That the following sums are hereby appro-
2 priated for the expenses of the county of Franklin for
3 the year nineteen hundred and four:—
4 For interest on county debt, a sum not exceeding
5 one thousand dollars.
6 For salaries of county officers and assistants, fixed by
7 law, a sum not exceeding six thousand five hundred
8 dollars.
9 For clerical assistance in county offices, a sum not
10 exceeding two thousand five hundred dollars.
11 For salaries and expenses of district and police courts,
12 a sum not exceeding six thousand dollars.
13 For salaries of jailers, masters and assistants, and
14 support of prisoners in jails and houses of correction,
15 a sum not exceeding ten thousand dollars.
16 For criminal costs in the superior court, a sum not
17 exceeding five thousand dollars.
18 For civil expenses in the supreme judicial and superior
19 courts, a sum not exceeding seven thousand dollars.
20 For transportation expenses of county and associate
21 commissioners, a sum not exceeding three hundred dollars.

22 For medical examiners, inquests and commitments of
23 the insane, a sum not exceeding one thousand two hun-
24 dred dollars.

25 For auditors, masters and referees, a sum not exceed-
26 ing six hundred dollars.

27 For repairing, furnishing and improving county build-
28 ings, a sum not exceeding three thousand dollars.

29 For fuel, lights and supplies in county buildings,
30 other than jails and houses of correction, and for care of
31 the same, a sum not exceeding three thousand dollars.

32 For highways, bridges and land damages, a sum not
33 exceeding thirteen thousand dollars.

34 For law libraries, a sum not exceeding six hundred
35 dollars.

36 For truant schools, a sum not exceeding two hundred
37 dollars.

38 For miscellaneous and contingent expenses of the
39 current year, a sum not exceeding one thousand five
40 hundred fifty-eight dollars and eighty-four cents.

41 And the county commissioners of said county are
42 hereby authorized to levy as the county tax of said
43 county for the current year, in the manner provided by
44 law, the sum of fifty-four thousand five hundred dollars,
45 to be expended, together with the cash balance on hand
46 and the receipts from other sources, for the above
47 purposes.
