AN ACT PROVIDING FOR MEMBERSHIP IN A RETIREMENT SYSTEM OF CERTAIN EMPLOYEES WHOSE SALARIES ARE DERIVED FROM FEDERAL GRANTS MADE TO THE COMMONWEALTH OR TO ANY POLITICAL SUBDIVISION THEREOF.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Clause (xi) of paragraph (a) of subdivision (2) of section 3 of
2 chapter 32 of the General Laws, as appearing in section 1 of
3 chapter 515 of the acts of 1952, is hereby amended by striking
4 out the first sentence and inserting in place thereof the following
5 sentence: — Any employee, any part or all of whose salary, wages
6 or other compensation is derived from federal grants made to the
7 commonwealth or to any political subdivision thereof, which
8 federal grants are used by the commonwealth or political sub-
9 division for the payment of salaries, and who as a result thereof
10 is eligible for membership in the United States civil service re-
11 tirement system, or who otherwise is eligible for such member-
12 ship, and who also is eligible for membership in any retirement
13 system established under this act, may have such portion of his
14 salary, wages or other compensation as is derived from federal
15 grants included in his regular compensation as defined by sec-
16 tion one, but as a condition precedent to membership, he shall
17 file an affidavit with the retirement board certifying that he is
18 not a member of the United States civil service retirement
19 system, eligible to make contributions thereto based upon his
20 current salary.
