## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

AN ACT REQUIRING THE COMMONWEALTH TO REIMBURSE CITIES, TOWNS AND DISTRICTS FOR ONE-HALF THE EXPENSES OF MAINTAINING APPROVED VOCATIONAL SCHOOLS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Chapter 74 of the General Laws is hereby amended by strik-
- 2 ing out section 9, as most recently amended by section 67 of
- 3 chapter 14 of the acts of 1966, an inserting in place thereof the
- 4 following section:—
- 5 *Section 9.* The commonwealth shall annually pay one half
- 6 the net maintenance sum to towns, or regional school districts,
- 7 maintaining approved local or district or regional school dis-
- 8 trict independent distributive occupations, industrial, agri-
- 9 cultural, household arts or practical nurse training schools,
- 10 except agricultural departments in high schools.
