Resolved, That the adjutant general be authorized to issue to each officer and enlisted man not now in the service of the militia who has received a long service medal under the provisions of section five of chapter five hundred and four of the acts of the year nineteen hundred and six, or of section ninety of chapter six hundred and four of the acts of the year nineteen hundred and eight, a war clasp indicative of such service. *Approved March 16, 1910.*
