AN ACT RELATIVE TO FUNERAL PROCESSIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Notwithstanding any general or special law, rule, or regulation
- 2 to the contrary, the Board of Registration in Embalming and
- 3 Funeral Directing is hereby authorized and directed to
- 4 promulgate rules and regulations requiring funeral directors to use
- 5 flags on the bumpers of all motor vehicles participating in a
- 6 funeral procession.
