By Mr. O'Farrell of Malden, petition of the Massachusetts Veterans' Services Agents Association, Inc., and George H. O'Farrell for removing the limitation on the amount of real and personal estate which may be held by widows of World War I veterans who are otherwise entitled to certain tax exemptions. Taxation.

AN ACT REMOVING THE LIMIT ON THE AMOUNT OF REAL AND PERSONAL ESTATE WHICH MAY BE HELD BY WIDOWS OF WORLD WAR I VETERANS WHO ARE OTHERWISE ENTITLED TO EXEMPTION FROM TAXES ON CERTAIN REAL PROPERTY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 As most recently amended by chapter 666 of the acts of
2 1962, clause Twenty-second of section 5 of chapter 59 of the
3 General Laws is hereby amended by striking therefrom in
4 paragraph (f) the words "and provided, further, that the
5 whole estate, real and personal, of such widow does not
6 exceed the sum of ten thousand dollars, exclusive of the
7 value of the mortgage interest held by persons other than
8 such widow in such mortgaged real estate as may be included
9 in such whole estate."
