

By Representatives Stefanini of Framingham and Gray of Framingham, petition of John A. Stefanini, Barbara E. Gray and David P. Magnani relative to authorizing the Division of Capital Planning and Operations to lease a certain parcel of land known as Wilson Cottage under the control of the Massachusetts Correctional Institute-Framingham in the town of Framingham to the South Middlesex Opportunity Council, Inc. State Administration.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE DIVISION OF CAPITAL PLANNING AND OPERATIONS TO LEASE CERTAIN LAND IN THE TOWN OF FRAMINGHAM.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The commissioner of the division of capital
2 planning and operations is hereby authorized and directed,
3 notwithstanding the provisions of sections forty E to forty J,
4 inclusive, of chapter seven of the General Laws, to lease for a
5 term of ninety-nine years a parcel of land with the building
6 located thereon known as the Wilson cottage on the ground of
7 and under the care and control of the Massachusetts Correc-
8 tional Institute-Framingham in the town of Framingham to the
9 South Middlesex Opportunity Council, to be used to provide
10 drug and alcohol detoxification services.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES

ARTICLE I
SECTION 1

All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 1. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

2. No Person shall be a Representative who shall not have attained to the Age of twenty five Years, seven Years, and seven Days, and who shall not, when elected, have seven Years Residence in that State: but no Person shall be a Representative who shall not, when elected, have been seven Years a Citizen of the United States, nor shall any Person be a Representative who shall not, when elected, have been seven Years a Citizen of the United States, nor shall any Person be a Representative who shall not, when elected, have been seven Years a Citizen of the United States.

SECTION 2. The House of Representatives shall be assembled in the City of New York, but they may, by Law, adjourn to other Places, and may hold their Meetings in any State in which they may be called.
