AN ACT RELATIVE TO SEARCH WARRANTS FOR PROPERTY OR ARTICLES HAVING EVIDENTIAL VALUE ONLY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1 of chapter 276 of the General Laws, as appearing
2 in section 1 of chapter 557 of the acts of 1964, is hereby
3 amended by inserting after clause Fourth the following
4 clause:—

5 Fifth, property or articles which there is probable cause to
6 believe will aid in apprehending or convicting the perpetrator
7 of a crime even though having evidential value only.

3 amended by inserting after clause fourth the following
4 clause—
- 5 "That property interests which have been purchased by
6 a party will not in any way affect the title of the
7 United States, though having substantial value."
