### AN ACT

Relating to certain Lands and Personal Estates in the  
Town of Auburn, and the Owners thereof.

*BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :*

1    SECT. 1. All lands within the limits of the town  
2 of Auburn, in the county of Worcester, which, by  
3 the provisions of the act incorporating said town  
4 with the original name of Ward, are now for certain  
5 legal purposes, accounted parts of Worcester, Mill-  
6 bury and Oxford, shall, after this act takes effect, be,  
7 and the same hereby are, for all legal purposes, de-  
8 clared to be parts of the said town of Auburn, and  
9 exempt from all legal liabilities in and to the said  
10 towns of Worcester, Millbury and Oxford.

1   SECT. 2. The taxes on polls and personal estates  
2 of persons having estate or interest in said lands,  
3 which, by the provisions of said act of incorporation,  
4 are now assessable in Worcester, Millbury, and Ox-  
5 ford, shall, after this act takes effect, be assessable  
6 and assessed in the said town of Auburn.

1   SECT. 3. All taxes heretofore legally assessed by  
2 the said towns of Worcester, Millbury, and Oxford,  
3 on the persons, lands, and other estates, referred to in  
4 the foregoing sections, shall be paid to said towns  
5 which have severally assessed the same, and said per-  
6 sons, lands, and other estates, shall continue liable  
7 therefor, to the same extent they are now liable for  
8 the same, notwithstanding anything in this act con-  
9 tained.

1   SECT. 4. Any persons having heretofore gained a  
2 legal settlement in said towns of Worcester, Mill-  
3 bury, and Oxford, by reason of residence on the lands  
4 referred to in the foregoing sections, or by having  
5 been proprietors thereof, or who may derive such set-  
6 tlement from any such resident or proprietor, who  
7 shall come to want, and stand in need of relief and  
8 support, shall be relieved and supported by the said  
9 town of Auburn, in the same manner as if they had  
10 gained a legal settlement in the said town of Auburn.

1   SECT. 5. This act shall take effect, from and after  
2 its approval.
