### AN ACT EXTENDING THE REGISTRATION OF RECREATIONAL VEHICLES FOR A PERIOD OF TWO YEARS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The second paragraph of section 22 of chapter  
2 90B of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the  
3 first sentence and inserting in place thereof the following sen-  
4 tence: — Such registration shall be valid for a period ending  
5 two years from the date of issuance, unless surrendered, sus-  
6 pended or revoked.

1 SECTION 2. Section twenty-three of said chapter ninety B  
2 is hereby repealed.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect on January first, nine-  
2 teen hundred and seventy-six.
