### AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE NUMBER OF JUSTICES IN THE FIRST DISTRICT COURT OF EASTERN MIDDLESEX.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 6 of chapter 218 of the General Laws is hereby  
2 amended by striking out the first sentence, as appearing in sec-  
3 tion 1 of chapter 738 of the acts of 1956, and inserting in place  
4 thereof the following sentence: — Each district court other than  
5 the municipal court of the city of Boston shall have one justice,  
6 except that the central district court of Worcester, district court  
7 of Springfield, municipal court of the Roxbury district, the first  
8 district court of eastern Middlesex and the third district court of  
9 eastern Middlesex shall have two justices each.
