AN ACT FURTHER DEFINING THE TERM "OFFICER" UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER THIRTY-TWO.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Subdivision (1) of section 26 of Chapter 32, as appearing in the
2 1994 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking in lines 3
3 and 4, the definition of "Officer", and inserting in place thereof
4 the following:—

5 "Officer", an officer of the department of state police appointed
6 thereto under section ten of chapter twenty-two C or appointed
7 under said section ten, for a period of not less than ten years and a
8 subsequently appointed as a special state police officer under the
9 provisions of section fifty-eight of chapter twenty-two C.
