RESOLUTIONS ON THE DEATH OF THOMAS R. BATEMAN.

Whereas, The Massachusetts Senate has learned with deep regret of the death of Thomas R. Bateman, who served this body as counsel from nineteen hundred and forty-eight to nineteen hundred and fifty-six, and as assistant counsel prior to that time. Mr. Bateman was an outstanding member of the House of Representatives, having served as chairman of the committee on the Judiciary and floor leader under the Honorable Leverett Saltonstall, the then speaker of the House; and

Whereas, Mr. Bateman's knowledge of law, of legislative procedure and of English and American constitutional history enabled him to serve the commonwealth with distinction in drafting and interpreting legislation and won for him a reputation as an authority on questions of constitutional law; now therefore be it

Resolved, That the Massachusetts Senate hereby extends its sincere sympathy to the family of Mr. Bateman; and be it further

Resolved, That an engrossed copy of these resolutions be sent by the Clerk of the Senate to the son of Thomas R. Bateman.
