The committee on Public Service, to whom was referred the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 1095) of Francis D. Doris, Edward M. Merrick, Jr., and John P. Flynn for legislation relative to the requirements for persons seeking employment in police or fire agencies of the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions; the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 1486) of Dennis D. Kuzia and Daniel E. Bosley for legislation relative to the educational qualifications of municipal police officers; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2557) of the Professional Fire Fighters of Massachusetts and John C. Bartley relative to a mandatory seven week training program at the Massachusetts Fire Academy for newly appointed fire fighters; and the section (accompanied by bill, House, No. 5401) of M. Joseph Manning for legislation to provide for a medical review board within the Massachusetts Criminal Justice Training Council, reports the accompanying order (Senate, No. 1652).

1 *Ordered*, That the committee on public service be authorized
2 to sit during the recess of the General Court to make an
3 investigation and study of House documents 2557, 5401 numbered
4 and Senate documents numbered 1095, 1486 relative to the
5 training of public safety officers, including without limitation,
6 police officers, correction officers and fire fighters throughout the
7 commonwealth, and to the administration of such training
8 programs.

9 Said committee shall report to the General Court the results
10 of its investigation and study, and its recommendations, if any,
11 together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such
12 recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the clerk of
13 the House of Representatives.
