RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO TRAFFIC CONDITIONS AND CONTROLS ON THE LYNNWAY IN THE CITY OF LYNN INCLUDING THE NEED FOR AN OVERPASS OR TRAFFIC CIRCLE AT THE INTERSECTION OF MARKET AND BROAD STREETS IN SAID CITY.

1 *Resolved*, That an unpaid special commission, to consist of
2 two members of the senate, one of whom shall be the senator
3 from the first Essex district, to be designated by the president
4 thereof, three members of the house of representatives from the
5 greater Lynn district, to be designated by the speaker thereof,
6 and three persons to be appointed by the governor, is hereby
7 established for the purpose of making an investigation and study
8 relative to traffic conditions and controls on the Lynnway in the
9 city of Lynn including the need for an overpass or traffic circle
10 at the intersection of Market and Broad streets in said city.
11 Said commission shall hold hearings and may call upon the
12 departments, commissions and officers of the commonwealth
13 for such information as it may desire in the course of its investi-
14 gation. Said commission may expend for clerical and other
15 services and expenses a sum not exceeding _____ dollars,
16 as may hereafter be appropriated therefor. Said commission
17 shall report to the general court the results of its investigation,
18 and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legis-
19 lation necessary to carry its recommendations into effect, by
20 filing the same with the clerk of the house of representatives not
21 later than the last Wednesday of December in the current year.
