AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE RETIREMENT OF JUDGES AT THE AGE
OF SIXTY-FIVE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 65A of chapter 32 of the General Laws, as most
2 recently amended by chapter 670 of the acts of 1956, is hereby
3 further amended by striking out in lines 18 and 29, the word
4 "seventy" and inserting in place thereof, in each instance, the
5 following word: — sixty-five.
