

**Chap. 443.** AN ACT ALLOWING THE DIRECTOR OF CIVIL SERVICE TO ESTABLISH EDUCATIONAL STANDARDS FOR POLICE APPLICANTS, UPON WRITTEN REQUEST OF THE APPOINTING AUTHORITY.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

Section 6A of chapter 31 of the General Laws, as most recently amended by section 1 of chapter 775 of the acts of 1965, is hereby further amended by adding the following paragraph: —

Notwithstanding the provisions of the preceding paragraph, upon written request of an appointing authority that certain educational qualifications be required for applicants for entrance to the police service in his particular jurisdiction, such educational requirements may be established by the director.

**Chap. 444.** AN ACT AUTHORIZING WORCESTER ACADEMY TO HOLD ADDITIONAL REAL AND PERSONAL ESTATE.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

Worcester Academy, incorporated by chapter forty-one of the acts of eighteen hundred and thirty-four, is hereby authorized to hold, for the purposes for which it is incorporated, real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding fifteen million dollars.

**Chap. 445.** AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF WORCESTER TO USE A CERTAIN PORTION OF INSTITUTE PARK IN SAID CITY FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING THEREON A POLICE HEAD-QUARTERS BUILDING.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. The city of Worcester may, subject to the consent of the Worcester Art Museum, as provided in a deed hereinafter referred to, and subject to the approval of the parks and recreation commission of said city, use the following described park land in said city for the purpose of constructing thereon a police headquarters building with such parking facilities as it deems adequate for such building: — a certain part of Institute park consisting of land located on the westerly side of Grove street between the water gate of the Worcester public works department, bureau of sewers, on Grove street and the land now or formerly of J. B. Lowell, Inc. at 173 Grove street, and extending westerly to the shore of Salisbury pond, and more particularly described in a deed from the Worcester Art Museum to the city of Worcester dated December 28, 1911 and recorded with Worcester district registry of deeds book 1982, page 265.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its acceptance by the city of Worcester. In the event that construction of said police headquarters building is not commenced within two years after the effective date of this act, this act shall become inoperative. *Approved July 14, 1967.*
