RESOLUTIONS

Requesting the United States Shipping Board to cause the Steamship George Washington to be repaired at the Charlestown Navy Yard.

1 *Whereas*, The steamship George Washington, belonging
2 to the United States government and under the control
3 of the shipping board, is now lying at the Brooklyn navy
4 yard awaiting extensive repairs; and

5 *Whereas*, At that yard and elsewhere there are numer-
6 ous other ships in process of construction or repair; and

7 *Whereas*, At the Charlestown navy yard there is a large
8 force of trained workmen, with every facility in the way
9 of docks, apparatus, machinery and material, but very
10 little work now on hand; therefore be it

11 *Resolved*, That the house of representatives of the
12 general court of Massachusetts hereby request the United
13 States shipping board to consider the expediency of forth-
14 with transferring the George Washington to the Charles-
15 town navy yard for such repairs and refitting as may be
16 necessary; and be it further

17 *Resolved*, That copies of these resolutions, properly
18 certified, be forwarded by the secretary of the common-
19 wealth to the United States shipping board, and also to
20 the senators and representatives in congress from this
21 commonwealth.

Resolved, That the Committee on the Judiciary be and it is hereby authorized to hold such public hearings as it may deem proper and necessary.

Resolved, That the Committee on the Judiciary be and it is hereby authorized to employ such clerical and other personnel as it may deem necessary.

Resolved, That the Committee on the Judiciary be and it is hereby authorized to make such expenditures as it may deem necessary.

Resolved, That the Committee on the Judiciary be and it is hereby authorized to report to the Senate and the House of Representatives the results of its inquiry.
