AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE INCLUSION OF THE EMPLOYEES OF THE NEW BEDFORD, WOODS HOLE, MARTHA'S VINEYARD AND NANTUCKET STEAMSHIP AUTHORITY WITHIN THE PROVISIONS OF THE EMPLOYMENT SECURITY ACT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Subsection (f) of section 6 of chapter
2 151A of the General Laws, as appearing in section 1
3 of chapter 685 of the acts of 1941, is hereby amended
4 by inserting after the word "subdivisions" in line 4
5 the words: — , except the New Bedford, Woods Hole,
6 Martha's Vineyard and Nantucket Steamship Au-
7 thority, — so as to read as follows: — (f) Service per-
8 formed in the employ of a state, or any political sub-
9 division thereof, or any instrumentality of any one or
10 more of the foregoing which is wholly owned by one

11 or more states or political subdivisions, except the
12 New Bedford, Woods Hole, Martha's Vineyard and
13 Nantucket Steamship Authority; and any service
14 performed in the employ of any instrumentality of
15 one or more states or political subdivisions to the ex-
16 tent that the instrumentality is, with respect to such
17 service, immune under the constitution of the United
18 States from the tax imposed by section sixteen hun-
19 dred of the Federal Internal Revenue Code, or any
20 acts in addition thereto and amendments thereof;

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect on July first,
2 nineteen hundred and fifty.
