AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING SMOKING IN PUBLIC CONVEYANCES AND CERTAIN PREMISES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 272 of the General Laws is amended by striking
- 2 out section 43A, inserted by chapter 358 of the acts of 1947,
- 3 and inserting in place thereof the following section:—
- 4 *Section 43A.* Whoever, in or upon a railroad carriage,
- 5 steamboat or other public conveyance, or on a car, train, bus,
- 6 terminal or other facility of the Massachusetts Bay Trans-
- 7 portation Authority, after being requested by the person in
- 8 charge of such conveyance or premises not to do so, or by the
- 9 operator, guard or other employee of the corporation or
- 10 authority operating the railroad, steamboat or public convey-
- 11 ance, smokes, or carries an open flame or lighted match,
- 12 cigar, cigarette or pipe, when a sign prohibiting such smoking
- 13 is displayed therein, shall be punished by imprisonment for
- 14 not more than ten days or by a fine of not more than fifty
- 15 dollars or both.
