To accompany the petition of William P. Grant for legislation to further regulate the retirement of certain employees of cities and towns. Pensions.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-Nine.

AN ACT REGULATING THE RETIREMENT OF CERTAIN EMPLOYEES OF CITIES AND TOWNS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Clause (f) of paragraph two of section twenty-nine
2 of chapter thirty-two of General Laws, as appearing in
3 section one of chapter three hundred and eighteen of
4 nineteen hundred and thirty-six, is hereby amended by
5 striking out the word "twenty" in the fourth line and
6 inserting in place thereof the word fifteen, — so as to
7 read as follows:— (f) If a member in either group
8 under age sixty is separated from service, through no
9 fault of his own, after the date of establishment of the
10 system and after having completed not less than
11 fifteen years of creditable service, he may, at his
12 election, in lieu of receiving his accumulated deduc-
13 tions, receive a retirement allowance to be computed
14 as prescribed in this section for a member classified in
15 Group 1.
