AN ACT PROVIDING FOR PARKING VIOLATIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 20A of Chapter 90 of the General Laws, as appearing
2 in the 1986 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out
3 the second sentence of paragraph five and inserting in place
4 thereof the following: —

5 If it is the first, second or third violation subject to this section
6 committed by such person in a particular city or town in the
7 calendar year, payment to the parking clerk of a fine of five dollars
8 for each such violation shall operate as a final disposition of the
9 case; and if it is the fourth or subsequent violation so committed
10 in such city or town in the calendar year, payment to the parking
11 clerk of a fine of ten dollars for each such violation shall operate
12 as a final disposition of the case; provided, however, that the
13 provisions of this sentence shall not apply to any violation subject
14 to this section committed in any city or town wherein the city
15 council or board of alderman, town council, board of selectman,
16 or traffic commissioner or traffic director having authority to
17 promulgate traffic rules shall have established by municipal rule,
18 regulation, ordinance or bylaw a schedule of fines for such
19 violations.
