## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Five.

RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO THE ADEQUACY OF EXISTING STATE TAX INCENTIVES UPON INDUSTRIAL LOCATION AND DEVELOPMENT IN THE COMMONWEALTH.

1 *Resolved*, That a special commission, to consist of three  
2 members of the senate, three members of the house of  
3 representatives, and two persons to be appointed by the  
4 governor, is hereby established for the purpose of making an  
5 investigation and study to the adequacy of existing state tax  
6 incentives upon industrial location and development in the  
7 commonwealth. Said commission shall, in the course of its  
8 investigation and study, consider:—the merits of tax incentives  
9 not in state law and the means of implementing such incentives;  
10 the effects of present or potential tax incentives for new  
11 businesses upon existing business in the commonwealth; the  
12 effect of present or potential tax incentives upon state revenues;  
13 and the policies of local government in the commonwealth  
14 relative to tax incentives promoting industrial development.
