AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE NUMBER OF LICENSES WHICH MAY BE ISSUED IN THE CITY OF CAMBRIDGE FOR THE SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES NOT TO BE DRUNK ON THE PREMISES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section seventeen of chapter one hundred and  
2 thirty-eight of the General Laws, as amended, is  
3 hereby further amended by striking out the paragraph  
4 reading "Notwithstanding the provisions hereof, no  
5 quota established hereunder for any city or town shall  
6 be decreased because of a loss in population of less than  
7 one thousand inhabitants", — and inserting in place  
8 thereof the following paragraph: — Notwithstanding  
9 the provisions hereof, no quota established hereunder  
10 for any city or town relative to the sale of all alcoholic  
11 beverages under section fifteen shall be decreased  
12 because of a loss in population of less than ten thou-  
13 sand inhabitants, and no other quota established  
14 hereunder for any city or town shall be decreased be-  
15 cause of a loss in population of less than one thousand  
16 inhabitants.
