RESOLVE

To provide for the Representation of Massachusetts at the
Lewis and Clark Centennial Exposition.

1 *Resolved*, That there be allowed and paid out of the
2 treasury of the Commonwealth a sum not exceeding six-
3 teen hundred dollars, to be expended under the direction
4 of the governor and council, to enable the Common-
5 wealth to be represented on the seventeenth of June,
6 nineteen hundred and five, at the Lewis and Clark Cen-
7 tennial Exposition to be held at Portland, in the state of
8 Oregon, by a committee of six persons, as follows:—
9 His Excellency the Governor or his Honor the Lieuten-
10 ant Governor or some citizen of the Commonwealth, of
11 recognized ability as a public speaker, who shall be ap-
12 pointed by the governor with the advice and consent of
13 the council, two members of the executive council, the
14 President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of
15 Representatives, and the Sergeant-at-Arms.
