

HOUSE No. 783

By Mr. Twohig of Boston, petition of James J. Twohig, Jr., that the trustees of the Metropolitan Transit Authority be authorized to restore a five cent fare on certain local lines. Metropolitan Affairs.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

AN ACT TO REDUCE THE FARES OF THE METROPOLITAN
TRANSIT AUTHORITY ON CERTAIN LOCAL LINES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The trustees of the metropolitan transit
2 authority shall restore the five cent fare on all local
3 lines and parts of said lines where the said five cent
4 fare was the existing charge prior to November first,
5 nineteen hundred and forty-six.

1 SECTION 2. The said trustees shall put the said
2 restoration of local fares into effect not later than
3 thirty days after the enactment of this measure.

THE COMPANSHIP OF MERCHANTS

Act to amend the laws relating to the said company

SECTION 1. That the said company shall be a body corporate with perpetual succession, and shall have the power to sue and be sued, to contract, to hold real and personal estate, and to do all such other things as may be necessary for the purposes of the said company.

SECTION 2. That the said company shall have the power to purchase, take on lease, or otherwise acquire any land or tenement, or any interest therein, and to sell, lease, or otherwise dispose of the same, and to do all such other things as may be necessary for the purposes of the said company.

SECTION 3. That the said company shall have the power to borrow money, and to give and receive any security for the same, and to do all such other things as may be necessary for the purposes of the said company.

SECTION 4. That the said company shall have the power to make and alter its bye-laws, and to do all such other things as may be necessary for the purposes of the said company.
