AN ACT TO LIMIT HOURS OF EMPLOYMENT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 49 of chapter 149 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by adding the words: — restaurants, summer camps, —
3 after the word “hotels” and by striking therefrom the words
4 “other than restaurants”, — so as to read as follows: — The two
5 preceding sections shall not apply to establishments used for the
6 manufacture or distribution of gas, electricity, milk or water,
7 hotels, restaurants, summer camps, drugstores, livery stables or
8 garages, nor the transportation of food, nor to the sale or de-
9 livery of food by or in establishments.
