Burke that the Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority be directed to install and maintain station stops in the Quincy Center, Wollaston, Norfolk Downs, South Quincy and Atlantic sections of the city of Quincy. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE MASSACHUSETTS BAY TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY TO INSTALL AND MAINTAIN STATION STOPS ON THE QUINCY-BRAINTREE EXTENSION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any provisions of chapter five
2 hundred and sixty-three of the acts of nineteen hundred and
3 sixty-four or of any other special or general law to the con-
4 trary, the Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority is
5 hereby authorized and directed to install and maintain on
6 the Quincy-Braintree extension station stops at the locations
7 of the former railroad stations in Quincy Center, Wollaston
8 and Norfolk Downs and at or nearby the locations of the
9 former railroad stations in South Quincy and Atlantic.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

The first section of the act provides that the Secretary of the Interior shall have the honor to advise the President of the United States of the receipt of any application for the admission of a territory to the Union, and to report thereon to the President at such time as he may direct.

The Department of the Interior

Section 1. The Secretary of the Interior

The Secretary of the Interior shall be appointed by the President, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, for a term of four years, and shall hold office until his successor is appointed.

He shall be aided by the Board of Geographical Names, and by the Secretary of the Board of Geographical Names.

It shall be the duty of the Secretary of the Interior to see that the laws of the United States are faithfully executed in the Department of the Interior, and to report to the President at such time as he may direct. He shall also see that the public lands are properly managed, and that the same are not alienated or otherwise disposed of, except in accordance with the laws of the United States. Section 2. This act shall take effect from its passage.
