AN ACT AMENDING AN ACT GRANTING AUTHORIZATION FOR THE TRANSFER OF CERTAIN LANDS FROM THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 724 of the acts of 1969 is hereby amended by
2 striking out lines 1 through 31 thereof and substituting there-
3 for the following: —

4 The area known as the Fowl Meadow marsh in Milton and
5 Canton is hereby designated as a wildlife and waterfowl refuge
6 of state and local significance. To preserve said wildlife and
7 waterfowl refuge, the metropolitan district commission is here-
8 by directed to plan for the creation of a wildlife habitat
9 improvement and wildlife refuge program in said Fowl Meadow
10 marsh for the purposes of creating open water areas, developing
11 a variety of habitat conditions, providing access for observation
12 and study of the flora and fauna in a two hundred and
13 ninety-four acre section of the Fowl Meadow marsh, and for
14 the further purpose of supplementing the wildlife education
15 program conducted by the Blue Hills Trailside Museum. For
16 the purpose of developing said plan for the Fowl Meadow
17 marsh, the metropolitan district commission is directed to con-
18 sult with the United States Department of Agriculture, soil
19 conservation service and the Massachusetts division of fisheries
20 and game.
