Resolve in Favor of Henry M. Lamson, Roderick L. Weston
and Joseph Soja, severally of Belchertown.

1 *Resolved*, That after an appropriation has been made
2 there be allowed and paid out of the state treasury to
3 Henry M. Lamson, of Belchertown, the sum of twelve
4 hundred and fifty dollars, to Roderick L. Weston, of
5 Belchertown, the sum of fifteen hundred dollars, and to
6 Joseph Soja, of Belchertown, the sum of one thousand
7 dollars, severally, in full compensation and satisfaction
8 for all claims and demands, whatsoever, against the com-
9 monwealth which they or each of them ever had, now
10 have or which they or each of them, or their heirs, exec-
11 utors, administrators or assigns, hereafter can, shall or
12 may have for all damages to their property or business
13 by reason of sewerage water escaping and released from
14 the sewage disposal beds erected on the grounds of the
15 Belchertown state school, or which may escape or be
16 released, from said beds as now maintained and operated
17 into the brook flowing down through the farms of the
18 aforesaid Lamson, Weston and Soja. The said amounts
19 shall be certified by the comptroller of the common-
20 wealth only upon the filing of releases, in form approved
21 by the attorney general, duly executed by the said Henry
22 M. Lamson, Roderick L. Weston and Joseph Soja, agree-
23 ing that the said sums are received in full satisfaction of
24 any and all claims against the commonwealth and against
25 any officer, agent or employee of the commonwealth.
