Conway and Fred Lamson (with the approval of the mayor and board of aldermen) for legislation to ascertain the will of the voters of the city of Melrose with reference to solving certain overcrowding in the school system of said city. ## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy.

AN ACT TO ASCERTAIN THE WILL OF THE VOTERS OF THE CITY OF MELROSE WITH REFERENCE TO SOLVING CERTAIN OVERCROWDING IN THE SCHOOL SYSTEM OF SAID CITY.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 For the purpose of ascertaining the will of the voters of the  
2 city of Melrose with reference to solving certain overcrowding in  
3 the school system of said city, there shall be placed upon the  
4 official ballot to be used at the state election in the current year  
5 the following question: —

6 “Which solution do you favor to solve the current overcrowd-  
7 ing in the Melrose school system?”

8 A. Construction of a new four-year high school on E11 Pond  
9 park, plus additional facilities to meet educational specifications  
10 YES . . . . .

11 B. Construction of an addition to the existing high school  
12 structure, plus additional facilities to meet educational specifica-  
13 tions  
14 YES . . . . .

15 If the number of yes votes in answer to subdivision A is greater  
16 than the number of yes votes in answer to subdivision B, it shall  
17 be deemed and taken to be the will of the voters of said city that  
18 the city construct a new four-year high school on E11 Pond park,

19 plus additional facilities to meet educational specifications and if  
 20 the number of yes votes in answer to subdivision B is greater than  
 21 the number of yes votes in answer to subdivision A then it will be  
 22 deemed and taken to be the will of the voters of said city that the  
 23 city construct an addition to its existing high school structure,  
 24 plus additional facilities to meet educational specifications.
