

By Mr. Lewis, a petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 789) of Alfred L. Podolski and Arthur Joseph Lewis, Jr., for legislation to authorize payment for accumulated sick leave and vacation leave to retiring justices of the Trial Court. The Judiciary.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING PAYMENT FOR ACCUMULATED SICK AND VACATION LEAVE TO RETIRING JUSTICES OF THE TRIAL COURT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 General Laws Chapter 211B Section 4 as most recently
2 amended by St. 1987, chapter 648, sections 7, 8, is hereby further
3 amended by inserting the following paragraph at the end
4 thereof: —

5 Any justice who retires and who has accumulated sick leave
6 credits shall be paid at an amount equal to twenty percent of the
7 value of such credits computed by multiplying the number of days
8 of accumulated sick leave available times the daily rate of salary
9 compensation received by the justice at the time of his retirement,
10 provided, however, that such payment for unused sick leave shall
11 not affect the amount of retirement allowance available to such
12 justice.

13 Any justice who retires and who has accumulated vacation leave
14 shall be paid an amount equal to the value of such days, not to
15 exceed thirty, computed by multiplying the number of
16 accumulated vacation leave credits available times the daily rate
17 of salary compensation, provided, however, that such payment
18 for unused vacation leave shall not affect the amount of retirement
19 allowance available to such justice.
