AN ACT

To fix the Minimum Wage of Scrubwomen.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The wages of women employed by the
2 commonwealth or any political subdivision thereof, as
3 office and other building cleaners, shall be not less than
4 forty cents an hour.

1 SECTION 2. Whoever pays or contracts to pay a wage
2 less than that fixed by this act shall be punished by a
3 fine not exceeding one hundred dollars, or by imprison-
4 ment for not more than six months.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall not apply to hotels, board-
2 ing-houses, apartments, dwelling-houses or private homes
3 or dwellings.
