AN ACT EXEMPTING THE POSITION OF SUPERINTENDENT OF HILLSIDE MANOR OF THE TOWN OF METHUEN FROM CIVIL SERVICE LAWS AND RULES AND PLACING THE POSITION OF SUPERVISOR OF NURSES, HILLSIDE MANOR, UNDER CIVIL SERVICE LAWS AND RULES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Upon the effective date of this act the position  
2 of superintendent of Hillside Manor of the town of Methuen  
3 shall not be subject to the provisions of chapter thirty-one of  
4 the General Laws.

5 The position of supervisor of nurses, Hillside Manor shall  
6 be subject to the civil service laws and rules and the tenure of  
7 office of Catherine Atwood, the incumbent thereof shall be  
8 unlimited. Said Catherine Atwood shall be subject to a  
9 qualifying examination by the division of civil service and if  
10 she passes said examination, shall be certified for said office and  
11 deemed to be permanently appointed thereto without being  
12 required to serve a probationary period. If she fails to pass  
13 said examination, she may continue to serve in said office but  
14 shall not be subject to said civil service laws and rules.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
