AN ACT PROVIDING FOR A PERIODIC INQUIRY BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WELFARE IN CASES OF TEMPORARY AND CONTINUED AID.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 3 of chapter 118 of the General Laws, as amended  
2 by section 30 of chapter 658 of the acts of 1967, is hereby  
3 further amended by adding the following sentence:—Within  
4 thirty days from the date of giving such prompt and suitable  
5 aid, the department shall make the careful inquiry provided  
6 for by this section; and in all cases where aid is granted and  
7 paid, there shall be a review of continued eligibility made at  
8 intervals of not less than sixty days thereafter.

By the House of Representatives, passed July 22, 1902, for the purpose of providing for the Government of the District of Columbia in case of emergency and in case of the absence of the President.

### The Constitution of the United States

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Two.

As the President is a natural person, he is subject to the same laws as other persons, and he is subject to the same laws as other persons.

He is elected by the people and those of legal age in the District of Columbia, and by the authority of the laws of the District.

1. Section 3 of Chapter 1 of the General Laws is amended to read as follows:
2. By section 30 of Chapter 1 of the Code of 1902, it is provided:

It is hereby amended to read the following: "Within three days from the date of giving such notice and within ten days thereafter, the electors shall make the several returns provided for by this section; and in all cases where it is required that a return shall be made, the electors shall be sworn in and shall be held in office until they have taken the oath of office."
