AN ACT

To incorporate the Village Congregational Society
in Cummington.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. William W. Mitchell, Edward F.
2 Warner, Erwin H. Thayer, William H. Shaw,
3 Henry M. Dyer, Edward H. Porter, Charles W.
4 Dawes, Darwin E. Lyman and all other members
5 of the Village Congregational Society in Cum-
6 mington and their successors as members of said
7 society, are hereby made a corporation with all
8 the powers and privileges and subject to all the
9 duties, restrictions and liabilities set forth in all
10 general laws which now are or hereafter may be
11 in force applicable to religious societies.

1 SECT. 2. Said corporation shall be called the
2 Village Congregational Society of Cummington.

1 SECT. 3. Said corporation may hold and con-
2 vey real and personal estate to an amount not
3 exceeding twenty-five thousand dollars, for
4 parochial and religious purposes.

1 SECT. 4. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
